Philosophy 349: Quiz One Due: March 27, 2008 in class

Part One

Explain what you believe to be the significant differences between the Sophists and Socrates (and successors, Plato and Aristotle). In your answer, analyze the strengths and weaknesses of both sides and give your opinion of whether one side has convincingly won this debate.

Part Two

Theories of "natural law" are a continuing theme within Greek and Roman jurisprudence. Explain the natural law theories of Plato, Aristotle and Cicero. Include in your analysis, differences as well as similarities - strengths as well as weaknesses. This question requires reference to the text for definitions of natural law as well as to our class discussions.

Part Three

Professor Kelly describes Cicero's theories <u>about</u> law as being separate <u>from</u> law as practiced within Rome. In order to be effective, does law need to have a theoretical foundation? Could law exist without a philosophical component? In answering this question, you may wish to consider your research in the previous two sections of this quiz.

Part Four

Which philosopher considered in class do you believe is most persuasive in his theories? Explain the reasons for your decision. You may also answer in the negative, with a detailed explanation for your response.
